For whatever reason or reasons, I always enjoy myself when I am there. This past March was no exception, when I attended the SAA Spring Retreat. The atmosphere is so all encompassing, so full of warmth and emotional safety, so nurturing. While the staff is friendly and go out of their way to make our stay as enjoyable as possible, I believe it is the hard work that the Retreat Committee puts in that makes the experience so profound for me.

I love all the activities, the speaker meetings, the workshops, the Talent/No Talent show (which to me is a misnomer because I see lots of talent expressed there). This year's workshops included workshops on the Second, Third, and Fourth Steps; Sponsorship; the Importance of God; Developing a Closer Relationship with Higher Power; Forgiveness, Intimacy, Surviving being a Survivor in Recovery and Re-entry.

While I attended the workshops on the Fourth Step, Developing a Closer Relationship with a Higher Power, and Intimacy, I had a very challenging time (as I always do) deciding which workshops to attend. They all sounded so appealing that I begrudgingly chose to miss six of the nine, choosing the three which seemed to be the workshops I was guided to by God.

The workshops I attended were all quite powerful and well done by the presenters. I am on the Fourth Step and so I got much out of that workshop. I have always struggled with embracing my Higher Power and so that workshop was amazing in the presenter's ability to be in constant close contact with his Higher Power. Finally, my addiction is an outgrowth of my intimacy disorder so attending that workshop also proved to be fruitful for me.

I also enjoyed wandering around, taking landscape photos, and sitting by the fire. The food there is pretty good and plentiful. Most importantly, I got to connect with God and with many of you in the fellowship. To be immersed in the recovery culture for 48 hours is indeed "Miracle Grow" for my program.

# Outreach

Reaching out in our communities to help the addict who still suffers, and demystify sex addiction and its stigma.

#### **Bay Area Outreach Committee**

Tradition Five states that, "Each group has but one primary purpose - to carry its message to the sex addict who still suffers." We at Intergroup have identified a host of possible programs that we could implement to accomplish this goal. We're limited only by the participation of those willing to volunteer and to lead. Ken H. has graciously offered to chair the Outreach Committee for our

#### **Newspaper Ad** Campaign

Intergroup is currently conducting an ad campaign to test the effectiveness of outreach via newspaper ads in local rags. After extensive research

on the circulation and demographics of leading papers in the area, the committee chose SF Weekly to test the campaign. With a in the paper and web editions for six consecutive weeks, one ad per week. We compared two versions of the ad to see if one yielded more responses than the other. Both provided the reader with a URL link to the Bay Area SAA web site and a very simple message: one

asked, "Am I a Sex Addict?", the other, "What is Sex Addiction?". We have been tracking traffic to the URL to measure the weekly circulation of effectiveness of each 85,000, ads were run ad. The results of the campaign are being evaluated now and the teams will make recommendations to Intergroup for future campaigns based on the findings. We'll share their report in the next issue of Out of the Fog coming out this summer.
