#### What is SAA?

Sex Addicts Anonymous (SAA) is a fellowship of people who share their experience, strength, and hope with each other so they may overcome their sexual addiction and help others recover from sexual addiction and dependency.

### **Reflections: The Recovery Puzzle**

"There are no extra pieces in the universe. Everyone is here because he or she has a place to fill, and every piece must fit itself into the big jigsaw puzzle." – Deepak Chopra

Life is like a complex jigsaw puzzle and so, too, is recovery from sexual addiction. For many addicts, the successful completion of a recovery puzzle makes the difference between sobriety and Self-destruction. Each puzzle piece is part of a large picture which, when completed, reveals the solution.

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When we begin recovery from sexual addiction it may seem like a complex puzzle has been scattered on a table for us to solve, alone. We may feel overwhelmed and confused. And, we may feel frustrated, lose our patience, and want to walk away from the puzzle. However, sobriety is not possible if we give up, surrender to addiction, and continue to act out. That said, we may have tried different ways to defeat our addiction which were not successful. Too often, painful slips and relapses were the outcome.

How do we get sober and stay sober? First of all, we put in place the four cornerstones of our recovery puzzle (life, body, mind, spirit). Then, we lock in place the four edges (strength, courage, wisdom, freedom). With guidance from our Higher Power, SAA and sponsors, we then determine the correct location of the remaining pieces in our puzzle. These pieces are the Twelve Steps. Each step consists of several important pieces which must be carefully examined with rigorous honesty, passion and purpose.

When we have completed our recovery puzzle it should reveal a sober and healthy picture of ourselves. And, within our minds and hearts, we know our self-esteem, self-confidence and problem-solving skills are stable and strong. Also, we can now heal from the visible and invisible wounds of our addiction. Moreover, we have the

strength, courage and wisdom to reject addictive and self-destructive thoughts and behaviors, one day at a time. With God's grace, we are deeply grateful to our Higher Power for the priceless gifts of faith, freedom and sobriety.

Ernest Hemingway wrote: "Today is only one day in all the days that will ever be. But what will happen in all the other days that ever come can depend on what you do today." And, to paraphrase the wisdom of St. Francis of Assisi: Do what is necessary. Then, do what is possible. And then, suddenly, you will be doing what you thought was impossible.

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### Perfectionism and Long-term Recovery

Nobody I know got into recovery for fun. We had blown our lives up to smithereens through the secret pursuit of arousal. We were spiralling about in the dark like an abandoned shell of a spaceship in a grade B science fiction movie but were still unable to stop our secret pursuits. Through a friend, a therapist, a chance encounter, higher power, somehow, we ended up in the rooms. There we met others who had also been reduced to shells, who had visited similarly dark places. We could see and hear and feel that some of them had been able to emerge, reassemble a life, and then even talk about it to others and smile and laugh.

I entered the rooms in the rainy season, 36 hours after the dam of my secrets broke in an explosive disclosure to my wife that lasted over a day and happened in front of my children. I began going to two, then three meetings a week. I found a sponsor. He had a slip. The tradition is that that means he had to drop me. So I found another sponsor. He helped me through my first step. I gave that step in front of the Los Altos Thursday evening group towards the end of the summer.

The second sponsor had a relapse and lost his own marriage a few years later. For several years I worked with a third sponsor who lived an hour and a half's drive away. After a few years that third sponsor had a slip and had to drop me. I returned to the second sponsor. He was now sober and in the beginnings of a second marriage.

Nothing lasts forever. Sponsorships. Marriages. Life. Sobriety. Perfection is an illusion, and for me, a character defect. I have slips. But now I also have at least a middling level of honesty and I have program people I can talk to, safely, about those slips. I had a sponsee who would say "Talking about my fantasies out loud takes the power out of them." Talking about what I am actually doing and thinking in weekly meetings does take the power out of the cravings and gives me confidence that I will never again find myself having sex in secret with other people, and will never again engage in the intense levels of destruction and hurt that I was doing to myself and the people that I loved during the height of my acting out, those many years ago. Thank you program. Thank you steps. Thank you program friends.


### Bay Area "Giving Thanks" Update







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### Fall 2024 Crossword - "Recovery Terms"
